VIETNAM – INDIA LOOK FORWARD TO REACH THE BILATERAL TRADE TARGER OF US\$ 15 BILLION BY 2020

Spoke at the 71st Republic Day of India, Dr. K. Srikar Reddy – Consul General of India in Ho Chi Minh City said that Vietnam was an important partner in India's Indo-Pacific Vision.

Dr. Reddy gave a broad idea of collaboration between both the countries ranging from political engagement, economic and development partnership, defence and security cooperation, energy cooperation, cultural exchanges and people-to-people contacts Consul General mentioned that over 35 business delegations from India visited Ho Chi Minh City and 14 business delegations from HCM city visited India.

In his address, Vice Chairman of Ho Chi Minh City People's Committee mentioned that he was glad that India Comprehensive Strategic Partnership has recorded impressive results in many fields. He stressed that Vietnam supports the Indian 'Act East' Policy and hoped that the two Governments could reach the target of US\$15 billion by 2020 in bilateral trade as envisaged by the two leaders.
